Numerous studies show that access to books and magazines is directly related to higher reading achievement. During the summer, it is *suggested* that every middle and high school student (grades 6th - 12th) read (1) book and complete (1) assignment on that book.

The lists on the page are **SUGGESTED** lists of appropriate grade-level books; however, this year, students will be allowed to read any book they choose as long as it is age-appropriate AND content- appropriate. **See these resources for free access to online texts:**

Assignments

Middle School (pick 1)

- Create a **flyer** with essential information using <u>www.smore.com</u>
- Create a **book summary** using PowToon, Storyboard That, etc.
- Create a <u>rap / poem/ song</u> (at least 4 verses / stanzas)
- Create a <u>Novel Word Cloud</u>. Type at least 20 words that help describe the setting, characters, plot, conflicts, tone, and themes in the novel.
- Create a Quizlet study guide
- Write a <u>letter</u> to the author explaining who your favorite character is, why you like that character, and why you liked the book

High School (pick 1)

- Create a piece of <u>artwork</u> (painting, sculpture, or other medium) that represents your understanding of the major themes, ideas, or messages in the novel. Include a typed 1-page reflection that shows your thorough understanding of the *entire* novel and makes a clear connection between your artwork and thenovel.
- Create a <u>scrapbook</u> (10 pages minimum) filled with objects and captions such as pictures, postcards, etc. that relate to events, characters, plot details, messages, and themes in the book. This scrapbook should include sufficient detail to demonstrate that you have read and understood the wholenovel.
- Create at least 40 <u>tweets</u> from one character to another at pivotal external or internal events. Be sure to caption
 each tweet with what part of the book this tweet would have taken place and what was happening in the novel at
 that time.
- Create a queue of 10 <u>Netflix</u> movies for the protagonist. Explain why the character wants to view each movie. How are character's thoughts, struggles, and triumphs mirrored in the movie choices?
- Create a <u>soundtrack</u> to go with your novel. Choose 10 songs you feel represent specific times throughout the novel. Write a description for each song that explains why you chose the song and what part of the book it pertains.
- Create an <u>ABC Book</u> for the selected novel. Using the alphabet, students will explore the characters, setting, symbols, literary devices, etc. that are relevant to the novel. Each page must include the word the letter stands for, a visual representation of the word, and a 4 5 sentence explanation of its relevance.
