PARTIAL SOLAR ECLIPSE MESSAGE

-NCSS Schools will maintain a normal schedule Monday April 8, 2024 during the partial solar eclipse, which is estimated to reach a maximum coverage of around 80% of the sun (from approximately 1:45 PM to 4:20 PM, with a peak around 3:05 PM). To turn this celestial event into a unique learning opportunity, NCSS schools will prioritize safe and educational activities for students. This may include live streams of the eclipse and other engaging instructional activities. We strongly encourage parents and guardians to discuss proper eye safety with their students during the eclipse. It's crucial to remember that looking directly at the sun, even during a partial eclipse, can cause eye damage. -Here are some important reminders:

- Parents who wish to check their children out of school early to view the eclipse may do so by following normal checkout procedures. Early checkout on Monday, April 8, 2024, will be considered an excused absence.
- All extracurricular activities and athletic events will continue as scheduled on April 8, 2024.
- Please help us emphasize the importance of not looking directly at the sun. Regular sunglasses, tinted windows, or looking out of a regular car or school bus window do not provide adequate protection and can cause eye damage.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY


